Jazztopad Festival is an annual improvised music festival in Wrocław, Poland organized under the umbrella of the National Forum of Music. It presents special projects and world premieres of pieces composed exclusively for the festival. Since its inception, Jazztopad has been showcasing Polish and international jazz artists and is considered to be one of the most unique festivals in Central Europe. Since 2008 its artistic director is Piotr Turkiewicz.
